

At approximately 6:30 a.m., August 28, 2015 Trooper Chad Wolf was on patrol with his department-issued motorcycle driving on northbound Dixie Highway crossing over southbound I-75 when a passenger vehicle towing a trailer collided with Wolf's motorcycle. Preliminary investigation indicates Wolf was dragged by the trailer on I-75 for several miles until the driver pulled over at the Holly Road rest area. The driver, a 72-year-old male from Waterford, is cooperating with the investigation.

Wolf, 38 years of age, enlisted with the MSP in 2008, graduating as a member of the 121st Trooper Recruit School. He has served at the Jackson, Flint and Metro posts. He has been a member of the Motor Unit since September 2013. Wolf is survived by his wife and four children.

Thousands of supporters – family, friends and fellow law enforcement officials attended Trooper Wolf's funeral held at Fenton High School in Fenton, MI on September 1, 2015. Represented among the supporters were multiple out of state police agencies, federal agencies including Department of Homeland Security, Canadian Mounted Police and hundreds of officers representing county and city departments from throughout Michigan. Governor Rick Snyder, his wife and daughter were also in attendance. Trooper Wolf's father is a State Trooper for the State of Illinois.

Colonel Kriste Kibbey Etue - Director of the Michigan State Police, Lieutenant Mario Gonzales (Wolf's supervisor), Wolf's brother, brother-in-law, close friend and pastor all addressed the audience with fond memories that produced both laughter and tears. It was evident from hearing his family and colleagues speak of him that he was devoted to his faith, family and profession. If you didn't know him, after hearing the

recollections of how he lived his life and performed his job, you certainly wished that you would have.

The route to and from the funeral was lined with well-wishers saluting law enforcement as they passed. Seen along the route were young children, veterans, and people from all walks of life. The fields next to the high school were filled with law enforcement vehicles that turned on their lights as they exited the grounds. Many travelled to the cemetery for the interment and the procession was led by the Michigan State Police motorcycle division.


